the out. chores

Quite a smart
rain

Van Boris made us
a short call. I like him
pretty well.

Sunday, September 5, 1869.

A most pleasant Sabbath morning
No meeting in the Church today
We shall you? Would you to
the Chappel in certain who preaches
I am much better but not
quite able to attend Church
(comfortably situated at home)

A Cumberland Presbyterian
I am told preached but he was
not much of a Preacher

No preaching at either Church
this evening

Monday, September 6, 1869.

A painful night - a gloomy morning
I see no shining cheering prospect
brightening in the future

I leave myself and all my
interests spiritual and temporal
in the hand of my Heavenly Father

My health is quite poor I can
scarcely expect to be much better
the enfeebled tenement must soon
fall. In that trying hour "Oh Christ
be thou my support and receive my
spirit."

dressed chickens - good.

I am trying to thresh my feed
beans - Mr Neal brought
Lyphens Mortgage to me
Campbell & Mellons Mortgage to me

Pardon made a sad mistake
in my buggy making it too
narrow - but of little consequence

Sunday, September 19, 1869.

Cloudy appearance of evening
storm. I have an appointment
at the new S. House near Stiles³
I brought out my Buggy for self,
and Wife grew dark wind rose
Commenced raining I took
off harness waited awhile appear-
ences more favorable put on
saddle led out horse at the
instant of starting it commenced
raining so I gave up the enterprise
Subsequently came of clear
Oh how badly I feel? but too
late no help - God bless the people
who may assemble³
Devoe Wife Lill & Nip Lyman stayed
had dinner - no end to talk
and why should there be?
Bro Br Hall called Rain prevented
his preaching for Mr Shaw in Genl
staid over night -

Monday, September 20, 1869.

Clear morning but very muddy

Tuesday, September 21, 1869.

Pleasant morning - rose early did

Rev Campbell occupied some
time.

Wednesday, September 22, 1869.

our house this afternoon He
says a very good one

Thursday, September 23, 1869.

117 in all I have dug 8 potato
tubs in S.E. corner of the garden
from Myers & Ben apples &c -

Friday, September 24, 1869.

Cloudy appearance of rain
covered potatoes to protect them

peaches scarce, they did fill 1

Saturday, September 25, 1869.

Very fine day I have done
a heavy job this forenoon
shoveling and shunting dirt in
to my hog bed -

Sunday, September 26, 1869.

Pleasant but cool

Rev. Dr. Campbell preached
to full congregation On Mark 16
your own salvation & preached
long loud and good

Evening Elder Gates
preached on "Our weary men in
his place" "Pigeon" army
very lengthy many good things
but quite tedious -

Mrs. Harwood was with
us through the day fine old lady
I think she is a Christian

Monday, September 27, 1869.

Pleasant cool day

I and Br. Campbell performed the funeral services of Dr. Wm. Parker on the 27th. He was 45 years old, member of the M. E. Church, was a member several years in St. Joseph. A good man has left a wife and some fine children all married. The Masons met us at Highland, formed an imposing procession to the Cemetery, when they went through these formula in committing the body to the grave -
