

Descendants of Solomon Pallen (1256)

Generation One

1. Solomon¹ Pallen (1256) was also known as Pahlen (1256). He was born before 1784 at Russia. His birthdate estimated from his age in the 1810 census.¹ He appeared on the census of 1810 at King and Queen County, Virginia, The family included 1 male under 10, 1 male 26-44, 2 females under 10, 1 female 10-15 and 1 female 26-44.¹ His death date has not been found.

Story from Ann D. Pallen: Solomon Pahlen was a Russian count and was involved in the assassination of Czar Paul and fled to the United States to save his life, changing his name to Pallen in the process. He was in the Napoleonic wars on the Russian side.

2. i. Moses Montrose² (1255) was born in 1810 at King and Queen County, Virginia. He married Janet Cochran (8417), daughter of William G. Cochran (8420) and Susanna M. McCannon (8421), on 6 April 1835 at Baltimore County, Maryland.

Generation Two

2. Moses Montrose² Pallen (1255) (*Solomon*¹) was born in 1810 at King and Queen County, Virginia.² He graduated from School of Medicine, University of Maryland, Baltimore, Baltimore County, Maryland, in 1835.³ He married Janet Cochran (8417), daughter of William G. Cochran (8420) and Susanna M. McCannon (8421), on 6 April 1835 at Baltimore County, Maryland.⁴

Moved to St. Louis from Vicksburgh, Mississippi.⁵ He was Professor of obstetrics and the diseases of women at the St. Louis Medical College. He was the founder and one time president of the St. Louis Academy of Science. He served as president of the St. Louis Medical Society between 1844 and 1870.⁶ He and Janet Cochran (8417) appeared on the 1860 Federal census of St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri, enumerated 30 June 1860. Their children Emma (8533), Salwin B. (8544), Edmund Gordon Edrington (8418), James Y. (8652) and Isabelle B. (8545) were listed as living with them. His age was listed as 50, occupation as physician and birthplace as Virginia. 5 servants were also in the household.⁷ He and Janet Cochran (8417) appeared on the 1870 Federal census of 2916 Olive St., St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri, enumerated 13 June 1870. Their children Isabelle B. (8545), Salwin B. (8544) and James Y. (8652) were listed as living with them.⁸ He died on 24 September 1876 at St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri. The cause of death was "Atony of bowels." St. Louis Death Records says 13 May 1866, but that conflicts with his being enumerated in the 1870 census and the DAR lineage records of his daughter Isabella.⁹ He was buried in Bellefontaine Cemetery, St. Louis, Missouri.¹⁰

From The Encyclopedic History of St. Louis: "Pallen, Moses M., physician, was born in King and Queen County, Virginia, in 1810, and died in St. Louis, September 24, 1876 He was reared in the "Old Dominion" and educated at the University of Virginia, at Charlottesville, from which institution he was graduated with class honors. Subsequently he studied medicine in the Medical Department of the University of Maryland, at Baltimore, and soon after obtaining his doctor's degree he went south, settling in Vicksburg, Mississippi. There he began the practice of his profession, and continued it seven years, leaving Vicksburg in 1842 to come to St. Louis Opening an office in this city in that year, he entered upon a highly creditable professional career, and for thirty years thereafter was a successful practitioner, and also a prominent medical educator. For over twenty years, and until within three years of his death, when he resigned, he occupied the chair of obstetrics in St. Louis Medical College, and is remembered as one of the professors of that institution who had the happy faculty of instructing and entertaining, at the same time, those who listened to his lectures and pursued their studies under his preceptorship. During the Mexican War he occupied the position of contracting surgeon at the United States Arsenal at St. Louis, and a little later he was health officer of the city during the administration of Mayor Pratt, holding that position during the cholera epidemic of 1849. He was one of the founders of, and an early president of, the St. Louis Academy of Science, and for several years was president of the St. Louis Medical Society, He was a terse and ready writer, and frequently contributed articles to the medical journals and newspapers on subjects of scientific a popular interest. He was all his life a close student and patron of literary, professional other societies designed to promote culture and scientific attainments. He helped to found the University Club; sought to make it in a measure, a literary, as well as a social organization, and was a frequent participant scientific and other discussions which took place under its auspices. He married Janet Cochran, daughter of William Wallace Cochran, a prominent merchant of Baltimore who was one of the

defenders of Fort McHenry in the War of 1812. He was survived by his wife, four sons and two daughters, The sons were Dr. Montrose A. Pallen, S. B. Pallen, E. G. Pallen and James Y. Pallen. His daughters became the wives respectively of Judge Irwin Z. Smith, of St. Louis, and Joseph Alger, of Washington, D. C.¹¹

Joan Noyes wrote "Moses Pallen (or his father) emigrated from Poland at the age of 13. The story is that Pallen, or Pahlen was originally a Russian name, and that they were Counts or something."

Ann Pallen wrote ""Pallen was a count, either Russian or Polish. My favorite story is that he was in on the assassination of Czar Paul and fled here for his life, changing the name. Aunt Francis told me the original spelling was Pajlen or something similar. He was in the Napoleonic Wars on the russian side. His first name was Solomon, his son was Moses, and Moses' son was Montrose who was grandfather Pallen's father."

Excerpts from a book called "Under Three Tsars" (rest of citation missing) refers to a Count Pahlen as Minister of Justice. The few pages available do not give any dates or the name of the Tsar in question.¹²

G. McArdle reports that the name Montrose came from the Duke of Montrose in Scotland who was part of the Graham Clan.¹³

Janet Cochran (8417) was also known as Jenetta Alexander (8417).¹⁴ She was born in 1814 at Maryland.¹⁵ She appeared on the 1880 Federal census of St. Louis, Missouri, enumerated 7 June 1880 in the household of Irwin Zebina Smith (9178) and Isabelle B. Pallen (8545).¹⁶ She died in 1884 at St. Louis, Missouri.¹⁵

Children of Moses Montrose² Pallen (1255) and Janet Cochran (8417) were as follows:

3. i. Montrose Anderson³ (243) was born on 2 January 1836 at Vicksburg, Warren County, Mississippi. He married Anne Eliza Benoist (244), daughter of Louis Auguste Benoist (245) and Esther A. Hackney (246), on 16 April 1857 at St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri.
4. ii. Emma (8533) was born circa 1840 at Mississippi. Her birthdate is calculated from her age of 20 in the 1860 census. She married as her first husband Felix McArdle (8534) on 9 November 1865 at St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri. She married as her second husband Joseph M. Alger (9177) on 23 March 1876 at St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri.
- iii. Salwin B. (8544) was born circa 1842 at Mississippi. His birthdate is calculated from his age of 18 in the 1860 census.¹⁷ He appeared on the 1860 Federal census of St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri, in the household of his parents Moses Montrose Pallen (1255) and Janet Cochran (8417).⁷ He married Elizabeth Gaty (9179) on 21 April 1866 at St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri.¹⁸ He appeared on the 1870 Federal census of 2916 Olive St., St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri, in the household of his parents Moses Montrose Pallen (1255) and Janet Cochran (8417).⁸ He died on 11 September 1873 at St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri.¹⁹

Elizabeth Gaty (9179) was born circa 1842. Her birthdate is calculated from an age of 24 in the 1870 census.²⁰ She appeared on the 1870 Federal census of 2916 Olive St., St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri, enumerated 13 June 1870 in the household of Moses Montrose Pallen (1255) and Janet Cochran (8417).⁸ She appeared on the 1880 Federal census of St. Louis, Missouri, enumerated 15 November 1880.²¹ Her death date has not been found.
5. iv. Edmund Gordon Edrington (8418) was born circa 1844 at St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri. His birthdate is calculated from his age of 16 in the 1860 census. (note: the number is hard to read.). He married Clara Harding (8419) on 3 May 1870 at St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri.
- v. James Y. (8652) was born circa 1846 at St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri. His birthdate is calculated from his age of 14 in the 1860 census.²² He appeared on the 1860 Federal census of St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri, in the household of his parents Moses Montrose Pallen (1255) and Janet Cochran (8417).⁷ He appeared on the 1870 Federal census of 2916 Olive St., St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri, in the household of his parents Moses Montrose Pallen (1255) and Janet Cochran (8417).⁸ His death date has not been found.
- vi. Isabelle B. (8545) was born circa 1855 at St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri. Her birthdate is calculated from her age of 5 in the 1860 census.¹⁷ She appeared on the 1860 Federal census of St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri, in the household of her parents Moses Montrose Pallen (1255) and Janet Cochran (8417).⁷ She appeared on the 1870 Federal census of 2916 Olive St., St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri, in the household of her parents Moses Montrose Pallen (1255) and Janet Cochran (8417).⁸ She married Irwin Zebina Smith (9178) on 5 November 1872 at St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri.¹⁸ She and Irwin Zebina Smith (9178) appeared on the 1880 Federal census of St. Louis, Missouri, enumerated 7 June 1880. Isabelle's mother Janet Cochran (8417) was also in the household. There were also four children in the house but the

names are hard to read. The oldest might have been Irwin's son from a previous marriage, and then three children from his marriage to Isabelle.¹⁶ Her death date has not been found.

Irwin Zebina Smith (9178) was born in 1827 at Massachusetts.²³ He appeared on the 1870 Federal census of St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri, enumerated 16 June 1870, along with his son Irwin, probably son John and another lawyer Samuel Knox. He was a lawyer.²⁴ He died in 1881.²⁵

Generation Three

3. Montrose Anderson³ Pallen (243) (*Moses*², *Solomon*¹) was born on 2 January 1836 at Vicksburg, Warren County, Mississippi.²⁶ He graduated from University of St. Louis, St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri, in 1853 Encyclopedia of the History of St. Louis says 1855.²⁷ He received the degree medicine in 1856 from University of St. Louis, St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri.²⁷ He married Anne Eliza Benoist (244), daughter of Louis Auguste Benoist (245) and Esther A. Their children Conde Benoist (241) and Esther Janette (1148) were listed as living with them.³¹ He and Anne Eliza Benoist (244) appeared on the 1880 Federal census of New York, New York County, New York, enumerated 11 June 1880. Their children Conde Benoist (241) and Esther Janette (1148) were listed as living with them.³² He died on 1 October 1890 at New York, New York County, New York, at age 54.³³ He was buried on 9 October 1890 in Calvary Cemetery, St. Louis, Missouri, Section 017, lot 0160.³⁴

His father, a native of Virginia, was professor of obstetrics in St. Louis medical college for twenty-seven years. The son was graduated at St. Louis University in 1853, and in medicine in 1856. After spending two years in hospital service and study in London, Paris, and Berlin, he began practice in St. Louis, Missouri. During the civil war he was medical director of General Henry A. Wise's legion in 1861, of General William J. Hardee's army corps in 1862, and afterward of the Department of Mississippi till February, 1863. He was subsequently sent to Canada by the Confederate government to report on the condition of the Confederate prisoners on Johnson's island. He returned to Richmond in 1864, and after a visit to Paris, France, where he obtained surgical and medical supplies for the Confederate armies, he was sent to Montreal again, but was captured on his way back to the south, and held on parole in New York city till the end of the war. After occupying chairs in various institutions, he was in 1874 appointed professor of gynecology in the University of the city of New York. In 1883 he assisted in forming the Post-graduate medical college in that city. Among other inventions by Dr. Pallen are a self-retaining vaginal speculum, peculiar needles for small and deep cavities, and various uterine supports. He has written much for medical periodicals, and published "Abnormities of Vision and Ophthalmoscope" (Washington, D. C., 1858); "Uterine Abnormities" (Cincinnati, 1866); "Prophylaxis of Pregnancy" (New York, 1878): and "Dysmenorrhoea" (1880).

From The Encyclopedic History of St. Louis: MONTROSE ANDERSON PALLEN was born January 2, 1836, in Vicksburg Mississippi. When six years old he came with his father's family to St. Louis and he was educated in this city, graduating from the St. Louis University in the class of 1855. Two years later he received his doctor's degree from the St. Louis Medical College, and immediately afterward went to Europe, where he continued his studies for a year longer. He returned to St. Louis in 1858, began the practice of his profession at once, and almost immediately impressed himself upon his contemporaries as a physician and surgeon of very superior attainments. When he was about twenty-one years of age he took the first prize for a paper read before the American Medical Association, on "The Ophthalmoscope," and it was he who introduced this instrument to the medical profession of this country. At the outbreak of the Civil War he joined the Confederate military forces, first serving as a surgeon under General Henry A Wise, and later was chief medical director on the staff of General Earl Van Dorn, serving in Mississippi, Tennessee, and other Southwestern States. At the close of the war he returned to St. Louis, where he resumed the practice of his profession, attaining great prominence. In 1874 he was called to New York City to fill the chair of gynecology in the Medical Department of the University of New York, and continued to reside and practice in New York until his death, which occurred in 1890. He married, in 1857, Miss Ann E.

Benoist, one of the daughters of Louis Benoist, who, in his day, was one of the most noted bankers in St. Louis, and whose career has been sketched elsewhere in these volumes. One son and one daughter were born of this union.⁵

Anne Eliza Benoist (244) was born on 29 June 1838 at St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri.³⁵ She appeared on the 1850 Federal census of St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri, enumerated 9 April 1850 in the household of Louis Auguste Benoist (245) and Sara E. Wilson (2590), her father and step-mother. She was enumerated as Eliza.³⁶ She lived at Montreal, Quebec, Canada, in 1867.³⁷ She worked with E. Senecal on the book *Histoire des grandes familles du Canada, ou, Aperçu sur le Chevalier Benoist*.³⁷ She died before 11 May 1897 at St. Louis, Missouri. She died of pneumonia.³⁸ She was buried on 11 May 1897 in Calvary Cemetery, St. Louis, Missouri, Section 017, lot 0160.³⁹

Her birth date is calculated from an age of 27 at her death, per the records of the Calvary Cemetery.⁴⁰ She appeared on the 1870 Federal census of St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri, in the household of her parents Montrose Anderson Pallen (243) and Anne Eliza Benoist (244).³¹ She appeared on the 1880 Federal census of New York, New York in the household of her parents Montrose Anderson Pallen (243) and Anne Eliza Benoist (244).³² She died on 28 March 1888 at St. Louis, Missouri.⁴¹ She was buried on 30 March 1888 in Calvary Cemetery, St. Louis, Missouri, Section 017, lot 0160.⁴²

4. Emma³ Pallen (8533) (*Moses*², *Solomon*¹) was born circa 1840 at Mississippi. Her birthdate is calculated from her age of 20 in the 1860 census.⁴³ She appeared on the 1860 Federal census of St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri, in the household of her parents Moses Montrose Pallen (1255) and Janet Cochran (8417).⁷ She married as her first husband Felix McArdle (8534) on 9 November 1865 at St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri.⁴⁴ She and Felix McArdle (8534) appeared on the 1870 Federal census of Carondelet, St. Louis County, Missouri, enumerated 5 August 1870. Their son Montrose Pallen (8535) was listed as living with them.⁴⁵ She married as her second husband Joseph M. Alger (9177) on 23 March 1876 at St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri.¹³ She and Joseph M. Alger (9177) appeared on the 1880 Federal census of Aleppo, Allegheny County, Pennsylvania, enumerated 17 June 1880. Her son Montrose Pallen McArdle (8535) was also in the household.⁴⁶ She died in 1898.¹³

Felix McArdle (8534) was also known as McArole (8534).¹⁸ He was born circa 1838 at Ohio. His birthdate is estimated from an age of 32 in the 1870 census.⁴⁷ His death date has not been found.

7. i. Montrose Pallen⁴ (8535) was born on 1 February 1868 at Missouri. He married May Funsten Reed (8536) on 20 April 1892.

Joseph M. Alger (9177) was born circa 1845 at Iowa (estimated).¹³ He appeared on the 1870 Federal census of Deer Lodge, Montana Territory, now Powell County, enumerated 13 June 1870.⁴⁸ His death date has not been found.

5. Edmund Gordon Edrington³ Pallen (8418) (*Moses*², *Solomon*¹) was born circa 1844 at St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri. His birthdate is calculated from his age of 16 in the 1860 census. (note: the number is hard to read).⁷ He appeared on the 1860 Federal census of St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri, in the household of his parents Moses Montrose Pallen (1255) and Janet Cochran (8417).⁷ He married Clara Harding (8419) on 3 May 1870 at St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri.⁴⁹ He and Clara Harding (8419) appeared on the 1870 Federal census of St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri, enumerated 16 July 1870.⁵⁰ His death date has not been found.

Clara Harding (8419) was born in 1852 at Kentucky.⁵¹ She appeared on the 1860 Federal census of St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri, enumerated 27 June 1860, in the household of her parents George and Leana Harding.⁵² She died in 1878.⁵³

Boyce (15597) appeared on the 1920 Federal census of St. Louis, Missouri, enumerated 16 January 1920, along with four children.⁵⁸ Her death date has not been found.

Conde Benoist⁴ Pallen (241) (*Montrose*³, *Moses*², *Solomon*¹) was born on 5 December 1858 at St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri.⁶⁰ He appeared on the 1860 Federal census of St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri, in the household of his parents Montrose Anderson Pallen (243) and Anne Eliza Benoist (244).²⁹ He appeared on the 1870 Federal census of St. Louis, St. Louis County, Missouri, in the household of his parents Montrose Anderson Pallen (243) and Anne Eliza Benoist (244).³¹ He graduated from Georgetown University, Washington, District of Columbia, in May 1880.⁵ He appeared on the 1880 Federal census of New York, New York in the household of his parents Montrose Anderson Pallen (243) and Anne Eliza Benoist (244).³² He received the degree MA in 1883 from Georgetown University, Washington, District of Columbia.⁵ He received the degree PhD in 1885 from University of St. Louis, St. Louis, Missouri.⁵ He married Georgiana McDougall Adams (242), daughter of Brig. Their children Charles McDougal (284), Conde de Sales (286), Esther Janet (7), Georgiana McDougal (287), Anne Elizabeth (288), Louis Auguste Benoist (289), Emma Mary (290) and Frances Josephine (10265) were listed as living with them.⁶² He and Georgiana McDougall Adams (242) appeared on the 1910 Federal census of New Rochelle, Westchester County, New York, at 197 Wigman Avenue, enumerated 2 May 1910. Their children Charles McDougal (284), Conde de Sales (286), Esther Janet (7), Georgiana McDougal (287), Anne Elizabeth (288), Louis Auguste Benoist (289), Emma Mary (290), Frances Josephine (10265), Louise Augusta (291) and Thomas Adams (292) were listed as living with them.⁶³ Conde (241) lived in Pelham, Westchester County, New York.⁶⁴

From The Encyclopedic History of St. Louis: CONDE BENOIST PALLEN, editor and author, was born December 5, 1858, in St. Louis. He was educated at Jesuit schools, first at St. Louis University, and later at Georgetown College, District of Columbia. He was graduated from the last named institution in the class of 1880; in 1883, received the degree of master of arts, "in cursu," from the same institution; and the degree of doctor of philosophy, "in cursu," from St. Louis University in 1885. Georgetown College conferred upon him the degree of doctor of laws in 1896. After his graduation from 'Georgetown College in 1880 he went to Europe, and for two years thereafter enjoyed the advantages of travel and residence abroad. His intention being to devote himself to literary and philosophical pursuits, he returned to his early home in St. Louis, in 1883 and soon afterward began writing for various magazines. In 1886 he was made editor of "The Catholic World," published in St. Louis, and when this paper was consolidated two years later with the periodical called "Church Progress," he continued in the editorial chair. He held that position until 1896, in which year he resigned it, "becoming known, in the meantime, as a talented lecturer, as well as a polished and forcible writer. He has lectured on literary subjects in many of the cities of the the United States, and at the Eastern and Western Catholic summer schools. In 1889 he delivered the Centennial Ode at the celebration of the centenary of Georgetown University and in the same year he read papers which attracted much attention on American Catholic literature, at the first Catholic Congress in Baltimore. His literary criticisms have taken high rank among those of American writers and Lord Alfred Tennyson, England's famous poet laureate, once wrote him a letter stating that his interpretation of "The Idylls of The King," as set forth in an article in "The Catholic World Magazine," of New York in 1885, met the full approval of the poet. In addition t various magazine articles .and monographs, he has published, in book form, in conjunction with Maurice F. Egan, some sonnets, this work having been given to the public in 1885. In 1897 he published a work entitled "The Philosophy of Literature ;" in 1898 "New Rubaiyot," and the same year, "Epochs of Literature." He married, in 1886, Miss Georgiana McDougall Adams, daughter of General John Adams, who served in the Confederate Army during the early part of the Civil War and was killed in the battle of Franklin, Tennessee."

⁵ He died on 26 May 1929 at Blackstone Hotel, New York, New York County, New York, at age 70.⁶⁵ He was buried on 29 May 1929 in Calvary Cemetery, St. Louis, Missouri, Section 017, lot 0160.⁶⁶

Joan Noyes wrote: "Conde met Georgiana when she was in Washington making her debut, and living with her grandfather. He went to school with Pope Pius X, spoke Greek and Latin, was editor of the Catholic Encyclopedia, wrote Catholic apologetics, a novel with the thesis that socialism cannot work (Crucible Island), and several volumes of poetry. He knew Chesterton and Belloc, and other eminent Edwardians, and was a very impractical man in his personal life."¹²

The census taker wrote "Conde Pallen" with a sex F and an age of 69. This actually matches Georgiana who was always called Mrs. Conde Pallen, thus the name confusion. Her husband Conde died in 1929.⁷⁰ She died before 11 March 1936 at New York, New York County, New York. Bertrand Fox, Former HBS Professor,
Dies at 92

Professor Emeritus Bertrand Fox, an economist and investment banking expert who had a lasting impact on Harvard Business School as director of its Division of Research, died on March 14 in Lexington, Mass., at the age of 92.

Fox was a distinguished member of the School's faculty for 25 years, beginning in 1949. He served as the Edsel Bryant Ford Professor of Business Administration from 1955 until 1967; from 1967 until his retirement in 1974, he was the first incumbent of the Jacob H. Schiff Professorship of Investment Banking. In 1984, Fox received the Harvard Business School's Distinguished Service Award.

As director of the Division of Research from 1953 to 1968, Fox had responsibility for funding and publishing all the research done at the Business School.

During World War II, Fox spent four years in Washington, D.C., in charge of the economic, statistical, planning, and programming staff work of the War Production Board. In that position, he came in contact with many Harvard Business School faculty members and became known at Harvard for research aimed at producing information needed by policy-makers. Fox later worked during the Korean War as an advisor to the Office of Defense Mobilization.

From 1958 to 1962, Fox was director of research for the U.S. Commission on Money and Credit, a major study of the nation's monetary system. He was also a co-founder of the Cambridge Research Institute. Upon his retirement in 1974, a number of colleagues established the Bertrand Fox Publication Fund to underwrite the publication of research studies and other faculty manuscripts.

A native of Wisconsin, Fox earned his A.B. degree in mathematics and astronomy from Northwestern University in 1929. After earning his A.M. (1933) and Ph.D. (1934) in economics from Harvard, he taught economics at Williams College from 1935 to 1949.

Fox is survived by his wife, Patricia (Noyes); four sons, Philip of Grosse Pointe, Mich., Thomas of Washington, Kenneth of Englewood, Colo., and Peter of Palo Alto, Calif.; two daughters, Ann Gulbransen of Sharon Center, Ohio, and Joan Fox-Bow of Yorktown Heights, N.Y.; a sister, Gertrude Tuttle of Tacoma, Wash.; and eight grandchildren. A memorial service will be held on Saturday, April 8, at 10 a.m. at the First Parish Church in Lexington.
